Kingston Parish Council

The following is a list of land and buildings owned by Kingston Parish Council

- **Kingston Village Hall.** Note that the parish council owns this as 'Custodian Trustee'. All matters relating to the hall, including day-to-day running, maintenance and insurance are the responsibility of the Village Hall Management Committee, a completely separate body. The management committee, as an unincorporated body, is not legally able to own property.
- The bus shelter
- The gazebo over the old village pump
- **Recreation Ground** in Crane's Lane
- The Orchard, between Rectory Lane and Church Lane
- **The Village Green,** which comprises the grass area to the south-west of the crossroads, and the grass verges extending some way beyond the crossroads in all four directions, including the triangular green at the junction of Rectory Lane and Church Lane
- **Field Road Green:** a part of this green bordered by The Green, Green Ley and Field Road belongs to the parish council. Part of this green, bordering Field Row, is privately owned.
- **The Sweards,** a narrow piece of land on the edge of the parish, between the B1046 just before it crosses the Bourn Brook just outside Toft, and the Bourn Brook itself.

Note that the allotments off Crane's Lane are not owned by Kingston Parish Council, but by South Cambridgeshire District Council. The parish council leases the land.
