## VICARS LETTER

The American naturalist Edwin Way Teale said, "How sad would be November if we had no knowledge of spring!" November as a month is widely held to be about as depressing as the diet we tend to be fed by the media. But for the last few days (as I write in mid-October) the news has broadcast sure signs of spring as the trapped miners in Chile emerged one by one, a witness to man's ability to persevere and hope against hope under the most intractable circumstances.

Just imagine the harrowing experience of what the miners endured: seventeen days of captivity nearly half a mile underground, for the first five days not knowing whether the rescuers were even looking for them. One of them described this as "a living hell". For seventeen days they survived on rations meant for two days. No one took more than his share. And they prayed together, regularly, at least twice a day. They supported each other, shared fears and hopes as well as the everyday tasks of keeping their "home" going. It was not until the miracle of their return to the surface one by one that they shed their group identity to become individuals again.

Everyone is talking of a "miracle" – and their rescue was one in many ways. A fractured world was pulled together, not only with "The 33" underground, but with engineers and rescue teams coming from all over the world, with the families bonding and praying together in "Camp Hope", with technology contributed on an international scale. If a miracle is something that breaks through the laws of how things normally work, the way in which solidarity just seemed to happen certainly fits that bill.

The second man lifted out of the mine is quoted as saying: "I was with God and I was with the Devil; they fought for me, but God won. He took me by my best hand, the hand of God, and I held on to him. I never thought for one minute that God wouldn't get me out of there." We saw many of them falling to their knees in thanksgiving on emerging from the capsule, unembarrassed to pray in public and with the world's media looking on.

What this "miracle" brings home to us is the importance of faith, of solidarity and of hope. But equally important is the interplay of man and God, including the role played in this by technology and international cooperation. This need for us to play our part in the purposes of God is summed up in the words of St Teresa of Avila.

Christ has no body now, but yours.  
No hands, no feet on earth, but yours.  
Yours are the eyes through which  
Christ looks compassion into the world.  
Yours are the feet  
with which Christ walks to do good.  
Yours are the hands  
with which Christ blesses the world.

This is one of the most important lessons the miracle of Chile should have taught us. It sums up our knowledge of spring.

Before the Reformation the patron Saints' days were major occasions in the parochial calendar, commemorated with special services and festivities. The late Revd. Mervyn Hills always took services on these patronal days and this year we revive the practice with sung Evening Prayer at 7.30pm. On this Feast of All Saints, also known as All Hallow's Day, congregations of all denominations, throughout the Christian world, commemorate, particularly, the faithful departed. Those who wish to remember their own loved ones, family or friends, are especially welcome to this service.
