Is your ditch overflowing?

A lot of people in the village have talked about flooding in recent months. Perhaps some are unaware that the problem is caused by ditches that are likely to be full of fallen branches, leaves, plastic bags, bottles, etc. I thought it might be helpful to remind people how to keep ditches running freely so that flooding is kept to a minimum and our roads are not damaged by excess water levels, which seep into the

substructure of the road and create potholes.

Normally at this time of year farmworkers would be hedging and ditching. If you have a ditch at the front or back of your property or garden, now is the time to check whether water is running freely in it. If not, take a spade (see photo 1) and, starting at the lowest point and working uphill, remove any silt laying in the ditch down to the clay bottom. I use a draining hoe (see photo 2) which was used years ago for the same purpose.

If you have a storm drain these should be kept clear of blockages and any new pipes should be of an adequate size. Our ditches and

storm drains are our responsibility. If everyone kept their ditch clear our roads would be in a better state and less likely to flood and break.



Nova Scotian Apple Crisp

For those who find making an apple pie too much work, this is apple crumble with a difference...

Ingredients:

(Note - the original recipe uses the North American volume method of measuring quantities - i.e., <u>not</u> weights - based around a cup being 8 fluid ounces. The measures below are regular European-style weights...)

- enough peeled and sliced apples to fill the oven-proof container that you are using - that is, approximately 4-6 medium-sized apples
- 4 ounces rolled oats (porridge oats work well)
- 4 ounces soft brown sugar
- 4 ounces of butter (i.e. 1/2 an American cup; these volume measures are marked on the packets over there!)
- 1 tsp ground cinnamon

Method:

Place sliced apples in a greased baking dish.

Combine the dry ingredients and cut the butter into them. A pastry cutter works well.

Sprinkle the mixture on top of the apples. The mixture clumps, so "sprinkle" is not always what happens... If you wish to make the mixture dryer, add more oats or even a little plain flour. Bake at 350°F or 180°C for approximately 30 minutes.

Good served warm with whipped cream on top.

The crumble topping can be used, with or without the cinnamon, for any fruit crumble. For example, makes an excellent blueberry, blackberry, etc., crumble.
