Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

Our local churches are unique to our communities: ancient buildings of great beauty and tranquillity which hold within them the collective memory of centuries of our forebears. For generations these church buildings have been the setting of high points of joy and the depths of anguish as baptisms, weddings and funerals have been carried out. They form the spiritual bedrock of our communities as each week, congregations gather to pray, to listen to God and to offer to Him the joys, sorrows, hopes and cares of the present moment. These buildings represent a social anchor and a spiritual beacon for all who live here. Some worship regularly, others have an occasional involvement and others have no connection at all until the unexpected events of life turn them in our direction: but whatever the level of involvement, the church is here for everyone, and the imperative of Jesus is to welcome, meet, listen and serve. The parish system in England means that every square inch of the land belongs to a parish for which there will normally be a church building and a nominated minister to oversee the spiritual and pastoral care of that place. This is a tremendous service to the population, and one which is being recognised and valued with renewed interest by our government as cuts to the welfare system are affecting the presence of statutory agencies within our communities.

Our churches – both the people and the buildings – receive no government funding or support, however. They are maintained and resourced by their local communities and, when need requires and laborious applications are successful, by grants from various trusts and charities. Our church treasurers work extremely hard to manage and raise the finance required to keep our buildings open and their diligence is hugely appreciated. Our outgoings include the cost of our buildings and churchyards, our running costs and insurance, and the cost of the ministry of local priests (including training and pensions) and the wider diocese and church which resources and supports this ministry. We also give a proportion of our income to other charitable causes each year.

The next few months represent the busiest time of the year for social and fundraising events around our villages, details of which you will find within this magazine. Churches have long encouraged social occasions which help to bind us together with our neighbours, building and affirming the bonds between us, and ensuring that community develops. These are events which would not happen without the goodwill, generosity, time, energy and creativity of many people within our parishes. And they aim to raise the vital funds which allow our ministry, and our church buildings, to retain a valued and appropriate place in the heart of our village lives.

I do hope that you will wish to be a part of some of our social events across the villages during the next few months, and that you will feel that the presence of a living church is important enough to want to support it with time, skill and finance so that the church can continue to be present for generations to come.

Dahl Curry (red lentil) Recipe

This is good as a side dish for a curry feast or on its own

1 Tbsp finely chopped onion
1 Tbsp vegetable oil
3 cloves of garlic, crushed
¼ tsp turmeric
¼ tsp chili powder
1 cup red lentils
1 ½ cups water
pinch of salt
½ tomato, chopped
½ tsp curry powder
½ cup coconut milk, or milk

- Brown onions and garlic in oil
- Add the dhal (lentils) to the onions and stir for a couple of minutes
- Add 1 ½ cups water and rest of ingredients except salt and coconut milk
- Simmer in a covered pan until the lentils are soft
- Add coconut milk and salt to taste
- Serve warm
