### Vicar's Letter



The Church of England is celebrating this year. It's the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the ordination of women as priests and it looks highly likely that by the end of the year we may have our first female bishops appointed. Twenty years ago over 700 women were ordained in cathedrals up and down the country: last month most of them gathered in St Paul's cathedral for a service of celebration. They received a rapturous standing ovation as they entered the

packed cathedral, each bearing within them the joys and burdens of carrying their image of God's love into a world which didn't always want to see it. For a young(ish!) female priest standing in the crowd, it was an electric moment for me when I felt caught up in something so much bigger than myself and yet something so very personal to myself: my own mum was one of those pioneer women.

Among the thousands of people in the crowds that day there was a banner which read 'A woman's place is where she is called to be'. Whether it's a matter of gender, religion, race, age, sexuality, disability or any other factor, this sentiment is powerful. A phrase we use in church refers to Jesus calling us into 'the fullness of life', an experience of life which allows the exploration of our full potential, whatever that might be, and encourages our flourishing as unique, complex individuals each made in the image of God. So often the limited expectations or negative presumptions of others can prevent us from flourishing as the people we were made to be. We especially need to appreciate and encourage the potential of the young people in our communities and enable them to aspire to be the very best they can. A Christian teacher many centuries ago said 'the glory of God is a human being fully alive.' When we can live fully alive – living life to the full – then perhaps God is inclined to say exactly what Archbishop Desmond Tutu said in his official message to the women of the Church of England last month: 'Yippee!!!!'
