

## Vicar's Letter

We're entering what's considered to be the season of goodwill and cheer and many of us are clearly focussed on the countdown to Christmas with its traditional expectation of midwinter warmth and pleasure. Yet as we watch the big stores launch their TV advertising campaigns aimed at selling us the perfect Christmas, we're also confronted with the desperate plight of the Philippines following the devastation of Typhoon Haiyan. Images of beautifully wrapped gifts and over-laden dinner tables are rapidly followed by images of a human fight for survival amid wreckage, hunger and disease. Such is the immensity of this tragedy that it has displaced from our attention the plight of the Syrian people. The United Nations High Commission for Refugees believes that 6 million Syrians, that's over a quarter of the population, have now been displaced from their homes, 2 million of them over the border into neighbouring Jordan, enduring an arid and dangerous exile in desert refugee camps.

When we step back and consider our British obsession with Christmas excess in the face of the extreme suffering and deprivation many parts of the world, let alone the tragedy, poverty and loss which afflict so many thousands of people in this country itself, it's easy to think of Christmas as a kind of collective anaesthetic – a social behaviour which allows us, or some of us, to bury our heads in the sand for a few weeks and ignore the ugly realities of life while we indulge in a short-term fantasy that life is actually not so bad after all. And some might argue that even if that is all Christmas is, is that really such a bad thing?

The Archbishop of Canterbury, in his concern for the exploitation of the poor and vulnerable, has criticised the culture which encourages the excessive spending and material expectation at Christmas which drives so many people into acute financial difficulties. The tragedy of this reckless consumerist drive, as well as the human suffering which follows, is that it has developed in the name of 'celebration' of the birth of Jesus, into a humble Jewish carpenter's family. Jesus, who was always among the poor and disadvantaged, living in a backwater of the Roman empire, who spoke frequently and with passion about good and bad uses of

money. And what St Matthew tells us in his Gospel account of Jesus' birth, is that not only was Jesus born in poverty and shame, but that in the first few years of his life he too was a refugee, taken by his frightened parents into a foreign country, Egypt, to escape the murderous paranoia of a despotic king. Jesus began life in circumstances familiar to over a quarter of the current population of Syria – homeless, helpless, displaced. Jesus began life on the underside of society, disadvantaged in every way. Yet it was this Jesus in whom God was pleased to dwell; it was this Jesus whom God called his 'beloved son'; this Jesus whose life was spent revealing to the whole human population what the love of God means for each and every one of us; this Jesus who embodied not just the human life of this world which we each experience, but that quality of eternal life which gives shape, meaning, purpose and beauty to this life.

Despite the juxtaposition of TV adverts with graphic news reports of human tragedy, a Christian celebration of Christmas is not a million miles away from the devastation of natural disaster, war, poverty, famine, disease and tragedy. A Christian celebration of Christmas finds its meaning in the raw and jagged reality of this world's pain – a pain into which Jesus was born, and in which he continues to be present, offering the possibility of redemption and a life of fulfilment which transcends this present existence. May we all know the peace of Christ this Christmas time.



**A14 upgrade:** Following extensive consultation a preferred route has now been agreed. Work is expected to start in 2016 and be completed in 2019. Go to this website for more information and details of the proposed re-alignment: <http://www.highways.gov.uk/roads/road-projects/a14-cambridge-to-huntingdon-improvement-scheme/>

**No. 18 bus:** our District Councillor informs us that the County Council has agreed to keep our bus running between Cambridge and Gamlingay. The service will continue to run as at present through Kingston, Monday to Saturday, although the timetable is likely to change in January. The 18A however will not be coming back.

**Planning Applications:** We will continue to keep you informed through the magazine of known planning applications in or close to Kingston Parish, but you may wish to be informed more

promptly about applications that are of particular interest to you. You can check on the South Cambridgeshire District Council website: go to <http://www.scambs.gov.uk/> and click on the link 'View a Planning Application'. You can then search by village and date range. If you have the reference number (e.g. for one of the applications listed below) then you can go directly to the application documents using the reference number. Normally residents likely to be affected by a planning application (e.g. close neighbours) will be informed by the Planning Department, and of course notices are fixed to a fence, telegraph pole or similar close to the property concerned.

- **S/0552/12/FL Temporary meteorological mast at land off Ermine Way, Arrington:** the appeal to the Secretary of State against refusal by SCDC of this application has been dismissed.
- **S/1988/13/FL Erection of replacement dwelling and garage, Kingston Wood Farm Cottages:** this application has been granted.
- **S/1083/13/FL erection of replacement dwelling and garage, North Farm house, Church Lane:** this application has been granted.
- **C/11/40/04851/13 Treework at Tranquil, Rectory Lane:** this application has been submitted for approval.

## New NHS Non-emergency phone number

The 111 service has been launched in Cambridgeshire. 111 will get you through to a team of fully trained call advisers, who are supported by experienced nurses and paramedics. They will ask you questions to assess your symptoms, and give you the health-care advice you need or direct you to the right local service.

The NHS 111 team will, where possible, book you an appointment or transfer you directly to the people you need to speak to. If they think you need an ambulance, they will send one immediately – just as if you had originally dialled 999.

You should use the NHS 111 service if you need medical help or advice urgently but it's not a life-threatening situation.

For less urgent health needs, you should still contact your GP in the usual way. For immediate, life-threatening emergencies, you should continue to call 999.

It is likely that the 0845 46 47 NHS Direct number will be closed down in the near future subject to approval from NHS England.
