Vicar's Letter

Rev Fiona Windsor

As I'm writing this letter there is a heavy frost that has kept the trees and hedgerows crystal white and sparkling all day; it looks beautiful and magical. Tiny snowdrops are emerging through hard, icy-white covered ground, reminding me of pleasures yet to come and moments that will be shared.

It's also the time of year when some people come over all 'hearts and flowers' and 'pink foil balloons and cards' sentiments around Valentine's Day. This is great for those who partake but I don't. I'm not a party pooper but I think it's getting very commercial, and its focus on romantic love can feel exclusive rather than inclusive. Love can be embraced in many forms: the love of two people, the love parents have for a child, the love that close friends can share. Essentially, love is about people; it's heart-warming, passionate, refreshing, and full of potential and ideas. Ultimately, it's about giving and receiving - it's certainly worth celebrating. Love is not about segregation but

unification; it's about what you can share.

In the first letter of Corinthians, Chapter 13, Paul reminds us what love really is about. It says: "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends". This is truly beautiful and inclusive, and that's how God loves us: totally and completely, always and forever, and love is at the heart of all the different relationships we have with God and one another.

Thanksgiving, celebration and sharing are the central purposes of who and what we are, bringing people together in all their differences to share love in the present and in moments yet to come. So, as we see snowdrops poking up through the hard frozen ground, let them be a

symbol to us of moments of pleasure and celebration of our love for one another, in all its different forms.

Parish Council News

40 mph buffer zone on Bourn Road: thank you for all your emails supporting this. The application for funding has been sent in and we expect to hear the result in March.

Bus service: in the search for solutions to the problem of the withdrawal of the no 18 bus, meetings are taking place between interested parties and representatives from Cambridgeshire County Council. Miki Ellar and Polly Ray are representing Kingston and have already attended one meeting, with another towards the end of January. One of the options being considered is Demand Responsive Transport: a minibus can be booked to provide your transport to, for example, a medical appointment, when required. An explanatory leaflet and questionnaire are enclosed with this magazine. Please read the leaflet and then complete the questionnaire. Contact me if you need more questionnaires. Please return completed questionnaires to Kathryn Hawkes (details in leaflet) or to me.

Local Plan: over 20,000 comments were received by South Cambridgeshire District Council in the first round of consultation. A further round on additional Issues and Options is being run from 7 January to 18 February 2013. This is split into two parts:

- Part 1: joint consultation with Cambridge City Council, dealing with issues that are important to both councils.
- Part 2: South Cambridgeshire issues.

All consultation documents are available on the SCDC website: www.scams.gov.uk/ldf/localplan. Please contact me if you wish to see paper copies.

Suggested Tradesmen: following an idea from a resident, we are hoping to add a 'suggested tradesmen' section to the website. If you have had satisfactory service from a plumber, washing machine repairer or boiler servicing man, you will be able to share your experience with your neighbours. This of course will not be a 'recommendation' with its associated implication of a guarantee, and users of the information are responsible for carrying out their own checks, but at least it will be a starting point.

South Cambridgeshire District Council will provide help for local businesses by creating a Business Support Fund: free advice and guidance to businesses operating in So Cambs for at least 12 months who can demonstrate difficulties due to the recession. Grants of up to £1,000 may also be available for further support. Those looking to start a business can attend a range of workshops to help them along the way. The free service, provided by Exemplas on behalf of the Council, will run until March 2013. News from your District Councillor

At the Kingston Parish Council meeting in January, I reported on a number of issues, including the new SCDC Local Development Plan, Issues and Options Part 2 Consultations that started on 7th January and will end on 18 February 2013. Kingston is not directly affected, but Toft and Caldecote are affected, with proposals for Bennell Farm and Bourn Airfield. Please send in your views.

SCDC is also reviewing its budget for 2013/14 with a view to trying to save £1.1m, and is now proposing to cut £300,000 from the grants that it offers to parishes for capital projects (such as village halls, play grounds etc.), and arts funding for the Village Colleges. More details will follow as this develops.

The business support service that SCDC launched last October is now entering its fourth month and has been offering advice, workshops and limited funding. It will only be available till the end of March 2013, so any business owners who are encountering difficulties due to the recession or anyone wanting to start a new business should get in touch online at www.exemplas.com/southcamb or call 0844 346 0755.

One of the ongoing issues that will help all of us and our local businesses is the availability of faster broadband. Registration for the Connecting Cambridgeshire project is still open, and homes and businesses should continue to register their demand.

Bus services, or lack thereof, continues to be an issue, in particular the future of the No 18/18A bus service. SCDC is working in partnership with the County to come up with alternative solutions, which includes the Demand Responsive Transport idea. I have summarised the principles on my website at <http://tumihawkins.org.uk/transport-on-demand>. SCDC would love to hear your views on this. The County is also consulting with residents and Transport Working Group was set up on Thursday 17th January 2013, with the task of coming up with cost effective solutions to meet the transport needs of the bus users, and hopefully encourage more people to use the services.

HELP TO BRING BETTER BROADBAND TO KINGSTON

Have you registered for the Connecting Cambridgeshire campaign to bring better broadband to Kingston? Good broadband connections are vital for our communities to grow and for our businesses to thrive. Everyone benefits if we can get faster broadband to the village.

It only takes a minute to go online at www.connectingcambridgeshire.co.uk or fill in a Freepost reply form in the leaflet at your local library or council offices. You only need to provide your postcode and a landline phone number, and whether you are a home or business user. It is important that most or all the homes and businesses register so that the exchange can be upgraded. The latest registration figures as of mid January is as shown in the table below.

Kingston has done well with nearly two thirds of the Kingston premises now registered. If you haven't already done so, please register and encourage everyone you know in these villages, both homes and businesses, to register. Recipe: Banana Loaf

Ingredients:

270g soft brown sugar	1 tsp baking powder
2 eggs	1 tsp bicarbonate of soda
200g mashed banana	1 tsp ground cinnamon
140g unsalted butter, melted	1 tsp ground ginger
280g plain flour	

Put sugar and eggs in electric mixer with paddle attachment (or use a handheld whisk). Beat well until pale. Add the mashed banana. Then add all the dry ingredients and incorporate thoroughly. Slowly add the melted butter and mix well. Pour mixture into a 2lb loaf tin and smooth over. Bake for about 1 hour at 170°C (325°F, Gas Mark 3) until a skewer comes out clean. Leave to cool for 5 minutes before turning out onto a rack. Enjoy!

DIANA ELIZABETH PIGGOTT 1931 – 2013



Diana was born at Ascot on the 3rd February, 1931; she had a younger sister, Katherine. On both sides her forbears were clergy and servants of the British Empire. Her parents met in Canada: Julian Ito Piggott was an oil man, while Helen Mackenzie had been summoned, at the age of 20, by her widower uncle, the Honorable Robert Randolph Bruce, Lieutenant Governor of British Columbia, to be his chatelaine. Such was the young Helen's charm and beauty that Lake Helen Mackenzie was named after her. Julian's father was Sir Francis Taylor Piggott, a jurist and writer, and Chief Justice of Hong Kong.

When war was declared the family moved to Scotland to stay with Diana's Uncle. After the war they settled in Southwell near Nottingham and later at Chase Moor End in Surrey. Julian Piggott worked in the Ministry of Aircraft Production and was involved in getting the wartime industry back to civilian production.

Diana was educated at Princess Helena College at Preston, Hertfordshire. She loved school, forming lifelong friendships and hosting reunions in Kingston in later years. She was a good scholar, excelling in languages, ancient and modern. The pupils would walk across the fields on Sundays to attend St Mary's church in nearby Hitchin. In 1949 Diana went on to do a degree in French and German at the University of Nottingham, followed by a secretarial diploma in London.

Sharing a flat with two PHC friends, Diana worked at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, becoming Secretary to the Principal, Edric Cundell. She was already adventurous and independent, travelling in Europe at every opportunity, forming an enduring attachment to Greece in particular. In 1961 Diana joined the Foreign Office and was posted to Munich.

In 1968 "A pin in the map brought me to Cambridge" Diana said, and she held a number of secretarial posts at the Faculty of Modern Languages and at Corpus Christi College, before retiring in 1989.

Diana came to North Farm House in Kingston in 1972, adding the two-storey extension so that she could care for her mother at home. Helen died in 2001 at the age of 96.

Diana's great passion in life was music. She was a pianist and kept up her playing into old age. Although a reluctant performer herself she enjoyed holding musical evenings at North Farm House, and went to concerts far and wide. She loved Schumann and Schubert and revered Benjamin Britten: the Aldeburgh Festival was a sacred fixture in her calendar.

Diana joined in village life and became a member of Kingston Parochial Church Council in 1975. She was PCC Secretary twice, the only incumbent of this office we've had who was able to take notes in shorthand. Needless to say she was extremely efficient and conscientious in this important role. Diana's Christian faith was deep-seated. Her religion wasn't a matter of mere observance. She had an enquiring mind, joining various house and bible study groups, attending the Alpha Course, lectures at the University of the Third Age, interested in other faiths too, and in "New Age" thinkers and therapies. She formed close friendships with our rectors, especially with the late Mervyn Hills, with Jeremy Pemberton (both musicians) and with the Revd David Kitching, late Vicar of Croxton. She was a great support to Paul Gildersleve when he undertook training for the ministry.

Diana possessed the impeccable manners and graciousness of an earlier age, but she was very much engaged with the world as she found it, interested in everything and everyone. She was a person of great generosity and a wonderful hostess. Above all she had a gift for friendship, keeping in constant touch with many people of all ages in all walks of life. She was devoted to her mother, Helen, and to her sister, Katherine. Her sensitivity gave her a natural empathy for others and her kindness extended well beyond her own circle. Diana knew more than her fair share of difficulties and disappointments but her courage and enthusiasm for life never deserted her: even in hospital in recent months there were flashes of her familiar mischievous humour.

Diana had a serious car accident in 2010, which left her paralysed. She was cared for at the Hope Nursing Home, with friends and family visiting regularly. Her survival was remarkable and is a testament to the care that she received but must also demonstrate the strength of her spirit and character. She died on New Year's Day, aged 81. The funeral service, meticulously planned by Diana herself as long ago as 1996, was held here at All Saints' and St Andrew's, the church that she loved, on 17th January, with the Revd Paul Gildersleve officiating. Ophelia Redpath gave the address, Gail Bragg read a poem and Tim Woollatt read the lesson from Revelation, Chapter 21. After the service Diana's remains were cremated. Sincere condolences to Katherine and to all Diana's family.
