## Vicar's Letter –

Dear Friends

Last year Travelodge ran a survey to find out if children knew the real meaning of Easter. It found that 53% of the children surveyed didn't know the meaning of Easter and one-quarter thought that it is about celebrating the Easter bunny's birthday. The one fact that does seem to be widely understood is that it is a time for eating chocolate, specifically chocolate eggs.

Eggs have been used for millennia as symbols of new life and have had an important part in the ceremonies of many different religions. A hard-boiled egg is included in the Jewish Passover meal, which Jesus would have celebrated the night before he died. Pagan Saxon worship associated eggs with fertility rights around the Spring goddess Eostre (from whom we derive the word Easter). Eggs have featured across the centuries and across cultures as symbols of life, especially renewed life. Originally birds' eggs would have been used; these became elaborately painted, often in red to symbolise the blood of Jesus, but as chocolate became a more widely available luxury food, they became chocolate eggs. The most elaborate tradition came from 19<sup>th</sup> century Russia where the aristocracy commissioned the French jeweller Faberge to produce fabulous enamel jewel-encrusted eggs which are worth a fortune.

For Christians, the egg is an iconic symbol of new life which connects with the very heart of the Christian story, which is all about the possibilities of life, new life, eternal life, breaking into the world, through Jesus and his own death and resurrection. The shape of an egg is also a reminder for some of the stone that was rolled in front of the tomb on that first Good Friday to seal in Jesus' tortured and defeated body, but which was rolled away to symbolise the release of his new and vibrant body on Easter morning. We regularly distribute chocolate Easter eggs at the end of our Easter morning church services as we enjoy this tradition. We'll even be holding an Easter Egg hunt in Longstowe churchyard at 10:30am (after the 9:30am Service) on Easter morning for any children who would like to join in. Anyone is welcome to join us at any of our Holy Week or Easter services and events as we explore the on-going meaning of Jesus' death and life in our world today.

## Lambing at Wimpole

**Lambing time is nearly here, come and celebrate the arrival of Spring at Wimpole in 2015.**

**7-26 April 2015**

### **What will you see?**

- You can listen to and learn from our Home Farm staff and volunteers - find out about Wimpole's rare breed sheep.
- At our lambing days, it's likely that you'll witness the birth of a lamb, if not, you'll certainly see lambs during their first few hours of life.

### **Birth and bonding**

Ewes lie down to give birth, standing up almost immediately in order to turn around and get to their newly-born lamb. After the birth, lambs and their mothers are left for a time to form a close bond. Once this has taken place, the ewe and lambs are moved into individual pens for 24 hours to ensure they settle in together.

### **In the days that follow**

Before the lambs are moved from this pen, they're given individual ear tags, enabling us to record which ewe they belong to and if they're male or female.

From the individual pens, ewes and lambs are put into group pens - providing the lambs are strong enough. After a few days here, they can then go out into paddocks, providing the weather is suitable. As the lambs grow up they're introduced to little pellets of food, which they eat more of as the mother's milk decreases.

## **The Victims Hub**

Cambridgeshire's Victims' Hub opened on 1 October 2014 with the purpose of providing local support to help victims of crime cope and recover from their experience. At the end of March the Hub completes its first six months of operation and has already received 3,340 referrals, supported 781 individuals and written to 11,630.

Victim Care Coordinators in the Hub offer emotional and practical support and will work with a victim to identify what they might need to help them cope and recover from the impact the crime has had on them.

The Victims' Hub brings together expertise from a network of support providers, offering a one-stop-shop that can help victims access the support they need. This integrated service allows a quick assessment of an individual's needs and the co-ordination of the delivery of the right services from across a range of agencies – particularly important for the most vulnerable in our society.

## EVERY FLOWER COUNTS – VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR ANNUAL STOCK TAKE OF UK'S WILDFLOWERS

### *Making plants a priority*

The new National Plant Monitoring Scheme (NPMS), launching in spring 2015, will for the first time enable scientists to take an annual stock take of the UK's wild plants and their habitats, but to do this we need the public's help. We are looking for volunteers to carry out surveys of wildflowers and their habitats that will provide robust evidence of which widespread plants are increasing or declining, as well as indicating the changing state of our most valued habitats such as grassland, fenland and even road verges. Plants are nature's building blocks and this new monitoring scheme will sit alongside existing schemes for the UK's birds and butterflies to help us understand more about how the countryside is changing.

The search is now on to find 2000 volunteers to take part in the NPMS who will play a vital role in gathering information. Together the volunteers will monitor wild plants in 28 important habitats, ranging from hedgerows and meadows to salt marsh and scree slopes.

### **How does the NPMS work?**

- Volunteers will be able to choose from three options depending on their level of expertise: recording from a short or an extended list of target species in each habitat or recording all species they find in their plots.
- Volunteers will be given a 1 km square with a grid showing up to 25 locations. Surveyors will be asked to visit three of those locations and carry out surveys in square plots and then identify two linear features such as hedgerows, rivers and road verges and survey these locations too.
- The squares have been randomly chosen, but with a focus on squares containing habitats of interest.
