## **Vicar's Letter** – From Revd Dr Alexandra Clarke

With only a few days to go now until the General Election, we are facing an unprecedented set of choices. The political landscape has changed significantly in recent years and it is by no means clear how the balance of power will emerge in this hard-fought contest. Each one of us is being called upon to think carefully and sensitively about the options facing us when we read our ballot papers and about the issues facing any incoming government.

Those issues, those problems, those responsibilities will be the same whatever the balance of power turns out to be and any government is going to face constraints caused by the global economic situation, increasing demands on the public purse in our schools, hospitals, police forces and so on and the pressures exercised by international affairs, especially the growing threat of extremism and terrorism. We must discern which political approach, of those on offer, is most likely to be beneficial for the citizens of the United Kingdom in the long term as well as the immediate future.

We have to beware, too, of just considering how far the pounds in our own pockets will stretch. No one disputes that the economic state of the country and the world affects all our lives – but what about issues of a moral rather than financial nature? Huge ethical choices are now possible – frighteningly so. How do you feel about questions like abortion limits, euthanasia and assisted suicide, matters of conscience v. public policy, labour exploitation by British companies in overseas manufacturing markets, educational standards and methods, religious freedoms, the position of Christianity and the Church of England in our national life, the integrity of politicians and public figures etc.? Do you know how the candidates and parties intend to proceed?

By the time you read this there may not be much opportunity to question our parliamentary candidates. But our civic responsibility should not end as we emerge from the polling booth – we should often and in many instances be making our opinions and anxieties felt. MPs realise that for every letter/communication they actually receive, there are many, many more sharing the same perspective. Part of our responsibility as Christians, indeed as citizens of this nation, is to be involved, which is why the Bishops recently wrote an open letter entitled 'Who is My Neighbour?' to encourage and inform such involvement in the run up to the election. The right to vote was won at considerable price – especially for women. Don't let's ignore or abuse it, but exercise it thoughtfully and prayerfully.

The Church of England has a prayer for election time:

*Lord, we thank you for the privileges and responsibilities of living in a democratic society. Give us wisdom to play our part at election time, that, through the exercise of each vote, your Kingdom may come closer. Protect us from the sins of despair and cynicism, guard us against the idols of false utopias and strengthen us to make politics a noble calling that serves the common good of all. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.*

## **Edward James Terence Brennan 1927 – 2015**

Ted Brennan was born in Sheffield in 1927 to Irish parents. He attended the King Edward VII School and then proceeded to Sheffield University after military service in the Royal Artillery. Ted and Joan met as fellow students and they married in 1953: they had two children, Caroline and Mark.

Ted began his career in management for Marks and Spencer, but soon found his vocation in teaching, taking his Diploma in Education and a further Master's degree at Sheffield. He became a Lecturer in Education, training teachers in Bournemouth and Poole in Dorset. The Brennans came to Green Ley in Kingston in 1966 when Ted was appointed Tutor in the History of Education at Cambridge Institute of Education, a post he held until retirement. Here he ran the Advanced Diploma for secondary teachers. He lectured throughout the UK and was twice awarded the British American Association's Mellon Lecture Fellowship in the USA. He became Secretary of the History of Education Society and published and reviewed widely.

Ted Brennan was a man whose company was always stimulating. He was good humoured and equable, a natural teacher. He believed that intellectual enquiry is an end in itself, and enjoyed serious discussion on any subject. He would look at an issue dispassionately, consider a question from different perspectives. But he wasn't someone who stood on the fence; he wasn't afraid to make himself unpopular. One of his finest hours was when he forced the first and only Parish Council election in Kingston's history after being told that he was not allowed to

graze his goat on the village green. In the event he polled the fewest votes in the ballot and therefore was not elected, but this illustrates his willingness to challenge authority on a matter of principle.

The Brennans left Kingston for Conduit Head Road in 1981. In retirement Ted found a congenial environment for further learning and teaching in the University of the Third Age in Cambridge.

Ted and Joan's son Mark was born with autism. Their devotion to Mark led them – with Canon Owen Spencer-Thomas and others – to become founders of the Cambridgeshire Autistic Society and of the East Anglian Autistic Support Trust (now Autism Anglia), and supporters of Middlefield Manor in Barton Mills, Suffolk, where Mark lived until his death last year.

Ted was a cradle Catholic but became agnostic. He perhaps felt that religion was a subject where 'more research is required', to use one of his favourite phrases.

Ted's funeral and service of celebration took place at Cambridge City Crematorium on the 12<sup>th</sup> March. His ashes are to be interred in Mark's grave at St Mary's, Barton Mills.

## Parish Council News

**Annual Parish Meeting:** this will take place on **Thursday 21 May** this year, at 8.00pm in the village hall. This is a public meeting – not a parish council meeting – at which reports are presented on a number of village activities including the Parish Council, the Parochial Church Council and the Village Hall Committee, and also reports from our local District and County Councillors. There is plenty of time for discussion and questions. Please come along to enjoy a glass of wine and keep up to date on what is going on in Kingston!

**Grass-cutting of verges:** a reminder that the County Council is responsible for cutting the grass verges outside the village, including the junction at the top of Church Lane. There are sometimes complaints that the grass here has grown, impeding visibility. As previously advised, the County Council is quite willing to cut these verges, but needs a reminder about trouble spots such as this. Please drop me a phone call or email if a trim is needed on this (or any other) corner and I will take the necessary action.

**Potholes:** the best way to get potholes fixed is to report them on the on-line reporting system. Go to <http://www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/> and click on 'Report a Highways Fault' – it's on the right hand side, near the top, under the heading 'Roads'. This does work – I've used it. And perhaps the more reports they get of a particular pothole, and the more potholes in a particular area, the more likely they are to be fixed.

**Village workday, 18 April:** many thanks to the volunteers who put in several hours hard work restoring and repairing a number of the damaged grass verges in the village, in particular to the Clears for their provision of topsoil and grass seed. All we need now is some rain to start the grass growing.

**Planning:** permission has been granted for change of use of Kingston Studio (the former chapel) to 'residential'.

## Kingston Village Hall Renovation Update

As most of you will now be aware, building work has begun on the village hall, which was greatly in need of both an upgrade and renovation. The building was once the village school, and after the school was closed it was purchased from Cambridgeshire County Council in 1977 and converted into the present village hall. Since then, little work has been done to the hall apart from essential maintenance. Phase 1 of the upgrade, which is currently in progress, is increasing the ceiling height and walls of the extension and includes a new kitchen, improved toilet facilities, increased and more secure storage and disabled access. There is also a new entrance lobby, which can now be seen on the north side of the old building. Externally the appearance of the building will be enhanced by a new pitched roof to replace a failing flat roof and larger windows to increase illumination internally. The photographs attached show that work was urgently required on the hall and include selection of images showing progress versus the original plan. Work commenced 2 weeks later than expected owing to grant application regulations regarding securing ALL funding before ground-breaking and issues relating to bees and asbestos but over the next 3 weeks the new roof structure should begin to appear.

Phase 1 of the renovation is only taking place thanks to the generosity of a number of grants. The following awards are the most notable: FCC Environment funding from WREN provided £49,500, Biffa Award £37,685, The AmeyCespa Community Fund £20,000, all via the Landfill Communities Fund, along with South Cambridgeshire District Council £38,500. Cambridgeshire ACRE has also provided a £20,000 loan to aid cash flow in the first 2 months of the build. Without these funds, this project would not have been possible as, despite considerable fund-raising efforts by village residents, the Village Hall Management Funds fell well short of the amount required to attempt any major renovation but were nevertheless instrumental in achieving the 10 % self-funding requirement of the grant-awarding bodies.

Events organised by the Village Hall Management Committee have purposely ceased on commencement of the renovation, since the village hall was used for most of the autumn/winter events and pub evenings. However, there will be events commencing in the summer, including the BBQ at South Sea Farm (27<sup>th</sup> June) and grand opening ceremony in July or August following completion of Phase 1.

We look forward to welcoming residents and their families and guests back to the new village hall.

# ORGAN CONCERT

On **Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> July at 7.00pm**, Keith Hearnshaw, Concert Organist will be coming to Holy Trinity Church, Elsworth to play. Here he is pictured at the console of the famous 30,000 pipe, 6 manual "Wanamaker" organ in Macy's store, Philadelphia where he performed a duet with the late American virtuoso, Carlo Curley.

A native of the West Midlands, Keith studied organ at the Birmingham Conservatoire, was organ scholar at St Chad's R.C. Cathedral, then Lincoln Cathedral under Colin Walsh and finally, at Liverpool Cathedral with Professor Ian Tracey.



Keith plays around 25 concerts a year and in August 2013, played to an audience of over 1,200 people at the outdoor Spreckels Organ in Balboa Park, San Diego. He has also appeared on 'The Organist

Entertains' (BBC Radio 2) and was the organist for the Royal College of Organists animation DVD which aims to inspire youngsters to learn the organ. Keith's concerts are always a treat, speaking to the audience in his jovial, extrovert manner and playing an 'everyman' programme in a similar style to his great friend and mentor Carlo Curley.

## Comberton WI Report for April 2015

Our April speaker was a return visit from Peter Carter, the Eel Man. This time, Peter spoke about his experiences of poaching on the Fen. Peter's family have lived on the Fen for generations and have made their living through eels, peat, willow and occasionally poaching to make ends meet. Peter continues in this tradition and has adapted his work over the years. He has 18 000 willows which are used for baskets, "green" coffins, garden structures and also willow screens which are used to protect riverbanks. Fen peat is now protected and can no longer be cut for fuel.

Peter began scrumping fruit as a child and progressed to snaring and catching rabbits, pheasants and partridges. The poaching laws were only updated very recently and poaching at night was a hanging offence. Gamekeepers waged war on the poachers as each tried to outwit the other. Peter showed us various methods of snaring and catching rabbits and pheasants. With a lifetime's experience, he was able to read the behaviour of the animals and predict their movements. He no longer deals in game as he cannot provide the required refrigerated storage. He used to hang them in a well! However, as one door closes, another one opens and Peter has been commissioned by Penguin to write a book about his experiences.

He will be appearing at the Ely Eel Day on 2<sup>nd</sup> May.

## Ely's Eel Day (Eel Festival) - 2nd May 2015

Taking place in Ely on 2nd May 2015, this celebration of all things slithery encompasses everything from eel throwing to eel tastings but it also has a serious side. The day itself, an annual festival, commemorates traditions that all too often ebb away, with folk music, dancing, historical displays, games, craft and food stalls.



It starts with a procession through the city headed up by Ellie the Eel – a giant version of the snake-like fish. Music is provided by Ely's Samba Band. The procession snakes through the city, along Waterside and arrives at the Jubilee Gardens.

Once there, families can compete in Eel Throwing, everyone can tuck into smoked and jellied eels washed down by a special Eel Day brew. As eels are an acquired taste, there is a hog-roast, pizza and various food vendors as an alternative. Eel Throwing is based on the popular village fete game wellie throwing.

The procession – and the day's events – start at 10.30 at Cross Green, which is next to Ely Cathedral.
