I wonder whether you have an Advent Calendar on the go? For many people, especially children, the countdown to Christmas can seem very long, and an advent calendar helps to make the waiting more bearable.

When I was young, an Advent calendar was a cardboard picture with little flaps which opened to reveal ... little pictures. That kind is still about, but nowadays Advent calendars are far, far more. There are ones with a small chocolate behind each number, or a big chocolate, or Lego, or beer, or Gin & Tonic, or ... almost anything.

The Body Shop Box of Wishes, is filled with skincare and beauty products, and it's a snip at  $\pm 145 - at$  least compared to the Dior version for  $\pm 470$ .

There are calendars based on books, films, TV series, and games, and some decidedly eye-opening ones! Possibly the most niche one I found was stocked with different beard oils.

Boots (and other places) advertise "Christmas Advent Calendars" – Laura Ashley has a "12 Days of Christmas Advent Calendar" which is very confusing because the 12 days of Christmas only begin once Advent has finished.

But that mixture of "now and not yet" has a lot in common with the Christian faith. Every Advent we wait for Christmas when we celebrate Jesus being born, because it's "not yet". At the same time we know that Jesus was born 2000 years ago, so he is here "now" as well.

Jesus himself taught his followers that "the Kingdom of God has come" – it is Now, but it's hard to see the evidence of that because it's Not Yet fully realised. The anticipation of Advent and the joy of Christmas are a picture for us of that Kingdom as we wait for it.

If you haven't sorted out your Advent calendar yet, why not have a look at the Leprosy Mission who we are supporting as a team of churches. Their shop theleprosymissionshop.com has some chocolate ones, and also a Tea Advent Calendar for some refreshing cuppas as you wait for the Not Yet of Advent to become the Now of Christmas.

On Friday 28<sup>th</sup> October some fifty people gathered in Kingston Church for a fascinating and most enjoyable concert performed by the Cambridge Mulberry Klezmer Band with vocal accompaniment by Natania Goodrich as soloist. It was most pleasing that the concert was well supported by Kingstonians who made up over a third of the audience.

We were treated to a really interesting, varied, and enjoyable programme providing an excellent opportunity to learn more about this traditional Jewish music which was taken up in the 1970's in New York and merged with Jazz. During the evening the close links to the music of other Eastern Mediterranean musical traditions became very evident.

During the interval the audience were treated to a fascinating short talk on medieval

wall paintings by Philip Walker, formerly of English Heritage, with particular reference to the wall paintings in Kingston Church.

Thank you to all who helped in any way to make the concert happen and to all who supported the concert on the night. Very special thanks must go to Simon Draper, who plays in the band, for arranging to bring the band to play in Kingston and for undertaking the critical organisation.

The icing on the cake was that a retiring collection at the end of the evening raised over £330 for the Church Restoration Fund and the repair of the church roof and ceiling.

can be as serious or as fun as you like. Groups of 4 – 6 people, hopefully in the village hall after being online for the last two years.


Due to the acoustics in the hall, if we are able with the new WiFi in the hall, we plan to present the quiz in both spoken and written format.


Cambridgeshire County Council has a Christmas Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme which is funded by the Department for Education. Families in receipt of income-related free school meals can access a holiday scheme for up to 16 hours per child and will receive enriching experiences, a meal and snacks daily. #### **New Parliamentary Constituency boundaries**

The Boundary Commission for England (BCE) are now consulting on their revised proposals for changes to parliamentary constituency boundaries (the areas that MPs represent). This final phase of consultation is open until 5 December 2022. The proposed boundaries remain the same as the previous proposals. Villages in Caldecote

Ward are to be moved to the newly named "St Neots and Mid Cambridgeshire constituency". You can view the proposed maps and make your representations on the BCE consultation website at <u>www.bcereviews.org.uk</u>.

This is for constituency boundaries only and does not impact Local Authority boundaries.






**Bus No.18 and Citi4**: The Mayor at Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority (CPCA) has overall responsibility for transport. As I've reported to parish councils and in my blog, he CPCA was able to provide funding of about £1.5m to replace the bus routes Stagecoach withdrew such as No.18 for Bourn and Kingston now run by Whippet. It also enabled Citi4 route to be maintained rather than rerouted to avoid Caldecote and Hardwick after I raised it with the Mayor's office so the route was tendered. This is for 6 months till end of March, whilst it works on a more permanent solution. See <u>https://transport.cambridgeshirepeterborough-ca.gov.uk/</u> <u>buses/bus-timetables/</u>

Both bus companies are having driver resource challenges and have cancelled services at short notice. **GCP Making Connections Consultation:** The Greater Cambridge Partnership (formerly City Deal) is carrying out a consultation on transforming the bus and active transport network between 2023 and 2028. It proposes to provide more services to more locations over longer periods, with cheaper fares set at £1/£2. Also to invest in new sustainable travel schemes, including walking and cycling links. The table below summarises the plan, with the congestion charge to be brough it in 2027/28 after the network has been improved. The consultation closes on 23 December 2022, so I encourage everyone to respond directly. 
#### South Cambridgeshire Christmas Market 2022

The PE Team completed a virtual 24-hour cycle on 4-5 November from Lands's End to John O' Groats (874 miles). They hope the 20 new bikes will allow the college to continue to offer cycling as an activity in PE lessons and extra-curricular sessions. The current bikes are now beyond repair and replacement bikes cost £300 each. The bikes offer students an opportunity to participate in an activity that provides physical exercise and also gives lifelong skills such as road awareness and safety, bike maintenance, teamwork and communication. # **My Three Ironman Athletes**

I have three daughters - all of them are Ironman finishers. All three girls started competing at a young age in Pony Club Tetrathlon (shoot / swim / run / ride), and have progressed over the years to Triathlon and Ironman events. October has been a busy month for the Richmond girls.

My eldest daughter, Sarah (representing Australia) took part in the Ironman World Championships in Kailua Kona, Hawaii on 6 October. This was a gruelling ocean swim

(3.8 k), bike ride (180 k) and run (42 k) in intense heat through a barren landscape and lava fields. She finished in the top 20 (of 187) in her age group, with an overall time of 11:21:09 h. Sarah fits her training, some 25 h a week, around work as an accountant in a top Australian company, qualifying events and many other commitments.

Felicity finishes 6th with a smile

My middle daughter, Felicity, competed in the Ironman 70.3 in Santa Margherita di Pula, Sardinia on 23 October. This comprised an ocean swim (1.9 k), bike ride (90 k) with steep hills and hairpin bends, and run (21.1 k). She finished 6th in her age group and was the 1st British finisher, with an overall time of 5:54:36 h and, as always, a smile on her face! Felicity is a dietician at Ipswich Hospital and has two young children. Her swim training is in the sea at Felixstowe and she often cycles between Ipswich and Kingston when she comes to see us.

Amanda, my youngest daughter who competes for Canada and has completed a full Ironman in previous years, also qualified this year for the World Ironman 70.3 Championships in St George, Utah, USA on 28 October. This was a reservoir swim, and steep cycle ride and run. Her finishing
