Vicar's Letter

There's a problem with books: how do you organise them?

You may just have them in a heap, but most people put them on bookshelves and have to decide which one goes where. Some people arrange their bookshelves by subject: crime here, cookery there. Some go for alphabetically – by author or by title. I've seen bookshelves organised by colour, and in the Cambridge University Library the books are arranged partly by size. Maybe your books just get slotted in to the next gap – or laid on top if there isn't one.

Actually, this is all beside the point. The purpose of books is not to be organised (or disorganised) on shelves: the purpose of books is to be read, enjoyed, learned from. If we aren't using them, they are just dust-collectors.

We find the same tendency in many areas of our lives: we pay lots of attention to non-essential details, but manage to overlook the real point. It affects us at home, in our communities, and at church.

We love our church building, so lots of people spend time and effort to keep the roof on the building, and the brass shiny, to make sure the altar-cloth is the right colour and the grass is cut, but we mustn't get so tied up in those that we forget the purpose of the building, which is to gather and worship God.

Jesus addressed this point when he told his followers "Look at the ravens. They don't plant or harvest or store food in barns, for God feeds them. And you are far more valuable to him than any birds! Your Father already knows your needs. Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and he will give you everything you need."

It's not just the church which needs to remember this lesson – we should all be looking at our lives with an eye on the biggest picture: what do we want our lives to be *for*? When we look at our lives, it doesn't matter how tidy or pretty our bookshelves are. What matters is the positive difference we have on making the world a better place – do we work for peace, do we oppose hatred, do we promote justice, do we love our neighbour?

We don't have to worry about what order we do them in, either.

Fund raising for ceiling and roof repairs

Fund raising for the Church Restoration Fund proceeds slowly but satisfactorily. The Ermine Street Band Concert on 22nd May raised £1,229, including Gift Aid: once again we record our thanks to them for playing entirely free of charge. The PCC has been awarded two more grants, both of £3,000: from The Benefact Trust (formerly The Allchurches Trust) and from The Prince of Wales Charitable Foundation: we record our sincere thanks to their trustees. Over the last month there have also been a number of very generous donations from parishioners. We are extremely grateful to all those who are supporting the PCC's efforts to undertake the repairs. We still need a significant sum – further grant applications await determination – and it is now clear that we will not be able to commence the works this year.

This gives us the time to secure the funding we need and also to plan for a major campaign of works, likely to take up to three months.

Jubilee Year

The Queen specifically said that she would like trees to be planted during this year, in her name. With this in mind we have planned a few tree related events to take place during the autumn in Kingston:-

Firstly, an acorn was planted over 6 years ago from a tree on the Clear family farm. Evidently it is from the 'Grandaddy' of oaks on our land! (says James Clear). It was on display at the Jubilee Picnic in the Orchard. The Oak is over 6 feet high. Due to soaring temperatures, droughts during our summers and our clay soil it is best to plant it in late October.

We would like to plant this tree, with a suitable plaque, as near to the centre of the village as possible taking in to account that it could grow to over 60 feet and were hoping for suggestions for possible sites. The Parish Council will then pick the place, after consulting specialists, as no-one wants tree roots growing under their house. The Council will inform everyone, via the village magazine, of date and time for planting.

Secondly, we have a long term plan for the establishment of a wood in Queen Elizabeth's name. A possible site has been earmarked near the village but it may take a little time to acquire the land. We already have promises from several villagers of mature trees that they have grown from local seed or small plants. The land may need to be cleared, trees planted and a maintenance plan considered. It would be wonderful if a lot of this work could be done by the villagers over a period of time.

Finally, a bulb-planting session over one weekend in October. Family groups would be encouraged to plant certain areas in the village with aconites, snowdrops and daffodils, etc., with an 'expert' to show them the technique. A plan is to be drawn up of areas to be planted and hopefully will be published in the village magazine together with the planned date.

Pensioners Can Apply For Household Support Fund

Cambridgeshire pensioners struggling with the rising cost of living can apply for support from the Household Support Fund thanks to a partnership between Cambridgeshire County Council and Age UK Cambridgeshire and Peterborough (Age UK CAP).

In March the Government announced the extension of the scheme, which initially ran between November and March, awarding Cambridgeshire an additional £3.58million to support those in need across the county, with a particular focus on support for pensioners.

Anyone reaching pensionable age by 30 September 2022 who lives in the Cambridgeshire County Council area can apply for support. Financial support can be provided within a few days as well as help to find longer-term support to maximise and manage finances.

Leaflets and posters will be distributed throughout the county in places like day centres, GP surgeries and libraries, and through Age UK CAP services, giving information about the scheme and how to apply.

£1.96m has also been provided for the provision of food vouchers with a value of £15 per child per week, for the 2022 May half term and summer holidays.

Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP) – Cambourne to Cambridge Busway Consultation Reminder that the C2C project consultation started on 16 May and is ending at midday on 11 July 2022. It is on the ways they propose to mitigate the environmental impact of the proposed busway as it links Cambourne to Cambridge via Bourn Airfield new village, a new Travel Hub at Scotland Farm, through Hardwick and West Cambridge campus via a dedicated busway. Luton Airport Flight Path and Holding Area change

The Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) approved the airspace change in November 2021 following public consultation from October 2020 to February 2021. Flights are supposed to be above 8,000 ft in most areas above our ward. Unfortunately, that is not what is happening now as some of you have noticed increased aircraft activity and noise levels. I am now working with a group of residents and Parish Councils so we can raise a formal objection to the CAA and London Luton Airport. We are also holding a public meeting on **Tuesday 5th July, 7.30pm at Little Gransden Village Hall** which I encourage those affected to attend, so we can work out how best to collate data to present.

East West Rail (EWR) drop-in events

The EWR Company have announced holding two community drop-in events in South Cambridgeshire in the coming weeks — and one in Cambridge. These are designed to provide communities with a chance to meet and speak to members of the project team. EWR say that they are still in the process of reviewing the feedback received during the second Non-Statutory Consultation and so do not have any new information to provide now. However, they do want to listen to views and will offer as much information as possible at this stage.

New Speed Limit in Bourn from 18 July

Highways England has approved a new 20mph speed limit in Bourn covering:

- All of Caxton End
- The lower half of Alms Hill extending along the High Street to Gills Hill i.e. just after the Caxton Road turning to the where there's a flashing speed sign on Gills Hill.
- All through Hall Close and Riddy Lane.

This will be implemented on Monday 18 July. You may see painted "20" signs on the road – this is where the 20mph roundels will be placed. This will help to keep us all, especially children and families, safer on the road.

In the same week, a pair of speed cushions will be placed at the bottom of Alms Hill (between the Lalbach and Caxton Rd entrance) to slow traffic entering the village.

Donate unwanted bikes to help Ukrainian families in need

Do you have any unused bicycles sitting in your garage or shed?

Your unwanted bicycles could now allow Ukrainian families to access their community and reach other families in the area. Over 70 Ukrainian families in Cambridgeshire have requested bicycles to assist them.

TAG Bikes, based at Huntingdon Community Centre, are involved in helping to repair donated bicycles and get them road ready for families in need. They are an employment skills-based project in Huntingdon under CCC's 'Supporting into Work' scheme, which teaches adults with learning difficulties how to repair unwanted bicycles and place them back into the community.

All types of bicycles that are in a reasonable condition are accepted, as basic care and repair can be carried out by the team. Unwanted helmets and other safety accessories, as well as spare tyres and bicycle parts are also welcome.

If you have any bicycles you would like to donate, then these can be delivered to TAG Bikes at Huntingdon Community Centre, 12a Ambury Road, Huntingdon PE29 1JE. Opening hours are Monday to Friday 9am until 4pm, and outside of those hours TAG Bikes have requested for bicycles to be left at the bottom of the community centre's car park. TAG Bikes would also be willing to collect bicycles that cannot be dropped off at their centre in Huntingdon.
