Vicar's Letter:

One of the things I'm noticing in my first year here in the Papworth Team is just how many daffodils there are. They seem to be everywhere – along the verges, around village signs, in churchyards, and suddenly appearing in patches of grass that looked completely ordinary just a few weeks ago. Almost overnight the whole place seems to have turned yellow.

As I'm still fairly new to the area, the appearance of these daffodils keeps catching me by surprise. Those who have lived here longer probably know exactly which banks and corners of the village will burst into colour as winter begins to loosen its grip. And yet, for me, each new patch still feels like a little discovery.

Of course, the reason these daffodils appear so suddenly is quite simple – the bulbs have been there all along. Throughout the cold and dark of winter they sit quietly underground. From the surface it looks as though nothing much is happening. And then, when the moment is right, they push up through the soil and suddenly burst into life.

In many ways the appearance of these daffodils reminds me of Easter. The first Easter morning also began in what looked like a place of endings and the disciples came to terms with a sealed tomb, grief, confusion and darkness. And yet, beneath the surface God was already at work. When the stone was rolled away the darkness was pushed aside and the good news began to spread that Christ had risen.

Easter reminds us that God is often at work in ways we cannot yet see, quietly bringing hope and new life. Perhaps that is why these sudden bursts of daffodils across our villages feel so fitting at this time of year; they are gentle reminders that after the longest winter, new life still has a way of appearing.

Across the Papworth Team churches we will be marking Easter Day and the season that follows in a number of ways, and you would be very welcome to join us. Forthcoming concerts in Kingston church

Harcamlow Music returns to Kingston on the evening of **Friday 5th June** with a programme of French baroque music for string trio. On **Sunday 19th July** the **Ermine Street Wind Quintet** will perform an afternoon concert. Admission will be free for both concerts with retiring collections for church funds. Refreshments will be served.

Funeral of Prof Stephen David Baxter 1969 – 2026

Because accessibility at Bourn church was limited, Stephen Baxter's funeral took place at Kingston church on March 6th: the Revd Petra Shakeshaft, a family friend, presided, assisted by the Revd Matt Phillips.

Stephen Baxter died on the 21st January 2026. He was a Fellow and Tutor at St Peter's College, Oxford, and Clarendon Professor of Medieval History at Oxford University, but he was a lifelong inhabitant of Bourn, brought up in Crow End, the son of David and Brenda Baxter. He was educated at Comberton Village College and Hills Road Sixth Form College, proceeding to Wadham College, Oxford, to read history. After graduation he worked for a few years in the City of London before returning to Oxford, studying for his DPhil at Christ Church. He taught medieval history at King's College, London, for ten years before his election to the fellowship of St Peter's in 2014. He was a renowned expert on the Domesday Book, one of three co-authors of the immense and ground-breaking book, *Making Domesday*, published last year. He was also well known for his love of sports and games, especially chess, tennis and cricket.

The church was full to capacity with many colleagues attending, besides family and friends. Prof Judith Buchanan, Master of St Peter's, gave one of several addresses. A memorial service will be held in June at his college (see www.spc.ox.ac.uk).

Michael le Quesne Herbert 16th October 1936 – 22nd February 2026

We very much regret to record the death of Michael le Quesne Herbert, of Keeper's Cottage, Kingston Wood, on the 22nd February. A service of thanksgiving for his life was celebrated on the 13th March at Longstowe St Mary's, the Revd Nigel Pearson presiding. R.I.P.

New Laws for Dog Walkers

New laws for dog walkers came into force in March which mean pet owners may face unlimited fines and up to a year in prison, as well as seeing their dogs seized. The updated laws extend police powers and mean dog owners can face huge penalties if their pet breaks the rules.

There are now clearer definitions around 'attacking' and 'worrying' to recognise that causing animals stress is enough to injure or kill. The Act will apply on public roads and paths that cross farmland or countryside, and more animals are included under the heading of livestock - including llamas and alpacas. The police will have stronger enforcement and investigative powers to find and identify dogs who have attacked livestock, and they can detain the dog if they think it could be a danger.

It is worth noting that the law does not just cover attacking or chasing animals but includes being at large (that is to say, not on a lead or otherwise under close control) in a field or enclosure in which there are sheep. So just being in the same space as sheep with your dog off lead would mean they are 'at large' and breaking the law even if they don't put a paw wrong. A survey last year by The National Sheep Association of their members found 87% of them reported having experienced a dog attack on their sheep in the previous 12 months and even a well behaved dog with good recall can in an instant find the presence of other animals irresistible. That means keeping your dog on a lead anywhere you might encounter livestock - even if you cannot see any - no matter how good your dog's recall is. You are not just protecting the livestock. You are protecting your dog. If you are walking in the countryside, and you are on footpaths across farmland, common land, or on moorland, or you are in a place you do not know well, you have to assume there could be livestock and put your dog on the lead.

Hayley Wood was closed during March due to numerous instances of abuse towards staff and continued disregard of the site rules by some members of the public in regards to keeping dogs on leads. When the site reopens it will have a no dogs policy. The Wildlife Trust has recently changed its policy to require all dogs to be kept on leads at its nature reserves year-round, except in a small number of areas.

Grant for Kaleidoscope

The Papworth Team received a £618 grant from the South Cambs Community Chest to help with setting up the Kaleidocope Café, which is designed to reduce isolation and loneliness among older people in Papworth Everard and surrounding villages. Its sessions are free and run by volunteers at Papworth Village Hall on the 2nd Monday of the month from 10am-12pm, with transport support offered for those who need it.
