News from the County

Flooding hotspots [response encouraged!]

The County Council recently allocated £400k to tackle parts of the highways which frequently flood, so as to reduce the risks associated with surface water on our roads. They are therefore looking for suggestions as to where frequent 'hotspots' might be. If this is something applicable to your village, please let me know as soon as possible so I can get it added to the list.

Household support grant extended to help those most in need

Support for people who are struggling to pay for essential items, food and utility bills will continue in Cambridgeshire thanks to an extension of the Household Support Fund. In March the Government announced the extension of the scheme, which initially ran between November and March, awarding Cambridgeshire an additional £3.58million to support children, families and pensioners.

Government guidance for this round is slightly different, so as a result, the County Council will be offering the following schemes using the funding:

- £1.96m for the provision of food vouchers with a value of £15 per child per week, for the 2022 May half term and summer holidays. Schools and childcare settings, including childminders, will be contacted directly and eligible parents will be notified.
- £1.2m to support households that include a person who has reached state pension age (66) by 30 September 2022 and are experiencing financial hardship in line with the requirements of the scheme.
- A boost for other services supporting those most in need

The County Council is partnering with Age UK to provide financial support for those of state pension age who are in financial need. People will also be offered wider support, such as access to benefits, support with securing the right energy tariff etc., to support them to manage their finances independently longer term.

Summer Holidays Activities and Food programme

Holiday scheme places will again be offered free-of-charge for families in receipt of free school meals, or where schools make a direct referral to the County Council indicating that the family is struggling financially. This will provide up to 64 hours with an approved scheme, including lunch, snacks and a variety of fun activities. News from GCP & Combined Authority

Cambourne to Cambridge Busway (C2C) – EIA Consultation

The next stage of the C2C design process is the Environmental Impact Assessment, and as part of that the GCP has launched a consultation showing the latest routes, plans for stops, and asking for your feedback on some of the decisions they are making. Although it doesn't explicitly ask for opinions on route selection/alignment, there are free-text boxes that would allow you to comment on this if you wish. You can find the consultation at:

Greenways

The Technical Preliminary Design Stage has begun for the Comberton and Haslingfield routes and planned to continue to December 2022. This involves: site walk throughs by the technical teams; topographical surveys; utilities searches; technical assessment of proposed structures; planning and environment strategy; environmental assessments (ecology, biodiversity, landscape, heritage, flooding, noise, carbon); highways and drainage design; lighting approach; cost estimation; stakeholder engagement; and identification of quick wins for delivery.

Public engagement (after engagement with Parish Councils) will be held in the summer for Comberton and Haslingfield, and the autumn for Barton to share the latest designs. Current dates, although subject to change, are:

- Comberton Village Hall: Friday 8 July, 2-7 pm
- Haslingfield Village Hall: Tuesday 12 July, 2-7 pm

Combined Authority Leadership update

An Extraordinary Meeting of the Combined Authority Board took place on Friday 20 May, having been requisitioned by some council leaders and the then Chair of the Business Board. The aim of the requisition was to force the resignation or suspension of the Mayor of Cambridgeshire & Peterborough, following various allegations which are still under investigation. However, between the requisition and the meeting, council elections had resulted in a change of leader in Huntingdonshire, and the Chair of the Business Board had also resigned. The attempt to depose the Mayor before the ongoing investigation had been concluded was therefore unsuccessful. I hope very much these issues will be resolved soon and the authority can return to delivering on core activities of better public transport, improving skills and tackling the climate emergency.

News from the District

Zero Carbon Communities Grant

The Zero Carbon Communities Grant scheme is open for its fourth year of applications. The deadline has been extended to 17 June. A pot of £120,000 is available for projects that help reduce carbon emissions or locking up carbon, or that promote community engagement on climate change. We have funded a wide range of projects in the area. Proposals can come from any community group, not just Parish Councils or formal charities. If you have an idea for a project, do get in touch with one of us or directly with the Communities team at South Cambs (details on the website), who are keen to talk about projects in advance of applications.

Energy Rebates

There has been some confusion about the Government's £150 energy rebate scheme. The scheme is aimed at providing a £150 energy rebate to those in properties banded A to D. It is not a Council Tax Rebate but is using Council Tax data to determine eligibility.

There are roughly 43,000 council tax payers that are eligible and just under 32,000 payment transactions have been made. The initial payments have been made to those that pay by direct debit as the Council already holds their bank details and in the vast majority of cases these match the details of the eligible person. This makes up over 70% of those eligible. There are a handful of situations where a direct debit is not paid by the person liable for Council Tax and those will need to fall into the second tranche of payments.

Those falling into the remaining 26% are now being invited to apply, providing evidence of their bank account but there will be an option for the £150 to be set off against their Council Tax liability if they so wish. All these applications will need to go through a verification process which helps verify that the information provided matches up with the person who is eligible. It is likely that some of these will require some further investigation so we are advising residents that the payment may take up to 14 days to process from receipt of an application but in many cases the payment should be made sooner.

If any residents are having difficulty receiving their energy rebate, please let me know.

SCDC support for Ukraine Refugees

The most recent data shows that 323 Ukrainian guests have now been welcomed to South Cambridgeshire involving 54 parishes. Supporting the government's Homes for Ukraine scheme, SCDC Officers have already made over 80 welfare visits and more than 400 DBS checks.

The Government scheme provides £200 per guest as a one-off payment to help with essential costs but gives flexibility to local authorities to decide if additional support is needed. In practice, hosts and guests in South Cambridgeshire have found that this money is insufficient to meet the guests needs between their arrival and when longer-term financial arrangements are in place. SCDC has therefore decided to increase the initial payment from £200 to £350 per guest. This is payable to all guests, including those who have already received the first payment. Free, good quality second-hand bicycles are being made available to guests as part of a collaboration between SCDC and two local charities OWL Bikes and Camtrust. Helmets and locks are also being supplied free of charge and the Council will also be providing guests with details of a free Bikeability

cycle training course, which will include translation. Once a guest applies for a bike and the Council confirms that they are eligible, they will be put in touch with the supplier nearest to them so that they can arrange to collect their bicycle. A county-wide scheme has been agreed that will see guests provided with 10 free bus tickets. Each ticket will allow unlimited journeys within Cambridgeshire for one day and are not time limited. Arrangements with Stagecoach are yet to be finalised but once the scheme is ready, SCDC will contact hosts with details. All guests will qualify and those who arrived before the scheme launched will still be provided with this support. The tickets are being provided to Cambridgeshire councils at a discounted rate by Stagecoach who are keen to support guests and we are grateful for their support.

English language tuition is available for guests from Cambridge Regional College, Workers' Educational Association and Cambridgeshire Skills. CamRuSS is offering further support for Ukrainian guests and hosts https://tinyurl.com/yuu6tn3y. Cambridge Regional College are offering a range of post-16 and adult education programmes from September onwards which includes English language tuition: https://tinyurl.com/2p82bktf

Markets

SCDC is keen to support and expand the market network in South Cambridgeshire as part of our commitment to grow the local economy, support businesses and ensure a wide choice of products is available for residents. Fitness and wellbeing grants

South Cambridgeshire District Council is urging instructors to apply for up to £300 to lead fitness and wellbeing activities in their communities. Anyone who leads an existing group or who wants to set up a new initiative in the District, such as leading a walking group in their local park or running a weekly yoga class in a village hall, could be eligible for the small grant. Providers running multiple groups can also apply to fund multiple programmes.

Activities could range from walking/football/rugby/netball to chair-based exercise classes, diabetes walking groups, yoga for the over 60s, baby yoga classes or more.

Other items of interest

Boiler Upgrade Scheme opens

The Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy (BEIS) has announced that the government's new £450 million Boiler Upgrade Scheme is now open for grant applications and payments. Homeowners can now benefit from £5,000 grants to fit clean heating systems when they come to replace their oil and gas boilers. This includes clean heating systems installed from 1 April this year. Heat pumps are now much cheaper and more competitively priced against gas and oil boilers, and closer to the cost of installing a traditional gas boiler. The scheme will improve the energy efficiency of homes, reduce energy bills and cut emissions in the long-term. The scheme has a committed budget of £450 million over three years from 2022-2025, and property owners will be able to get:

- £5,000 off the cost and installation of an air source heat pump ·
- £5,000 off the cost and installation of a biomass boiler ·
- £6,000 off the cost and installation of a ground source heat pump

District Council Administration 2022

The first Full Council of the new municipal year took place on Thursday 26 May 2022. The new Council Chairman and Vice Chairman were elected, the new cabinet was confirmed, and details of the portfolios can be found at https://tumihawkins.org.uk/cabinet-confirmed-south-cambs-2022-annual-meeting/. I am pleased to be back and continuing with the responsibility for Planning policy and Development control. The committee seats were also allocated and agreed, according to the political proportionality.

Development Management Area Team restructure

The Area Team structure we have been working with is shown on the GCSPS website at https://greatercambridgeplanning.org/about-us/contact-us/development-management-area-teams/ with Caldecote Ward villages being in Area 3. Due to the unexpected loss of two senior planners (down to ill-health), the teams are now temporarily moving from three to two, namely Area West and Area East. Caldecote Ward villages will be in Area West. Remember that the Area Team Leader is your first port of call for planning issues that may be of concern, and are available to offer advice and assistance to Parish Councils.

The quarterly meetings previously scheduled for mid June have been cancelled and a new date will

be rescheduled once the new restructure takes effect. Please watch out for the formal notifications and again do make a point of attending as it is good forum to find out about planning issues.

A428 Development Community Forums (Cambourne and Bourn Airfield)

The economy of South Cambridgeshire is growing, which is why the level of development set out in Local Plans is increasing, to cater for the needs of the district and for the businesses. For our part of the district, the 2018 Local Plan set major sites at Cambourne West and Bourn Airfield. Work on Cambourne West is well under way, but none has started in Bourn Airfield. The Community forums have been set up as a means of providing relevant information on the work going on in those sites, and to hear from neighbouring communities any issues of concern. The forums are separate for Cambourne West and Bourn Airfield, running back-to-back on the same day. The next meetings is Wednesday 6th July 2022. I encourage all Parish Councils, especially Caldecote and Bourn to please put this date in your diary to attend. 
Greater Cambridge Partnership - Cambourne to Cambridge Busway Consultation

The Greater Cambridge Partnership (GCP) has announced its latest consultation for the Cambourne to Cambridge (C2C) Better Public Transport Project taking place from 16 May to 11 July 2022. This public transport route is to link Cambourne to Cambridge via the new Bourn Airfield development, a new Travel Hub at Scotland Farm, through Hardwick and West Cambridge campus via a dedicated busway. In addition, active travel path for pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders is proposed to run alongside and connect with other routes in the area.

Residents in Bourn and Caldecote are particularly affected by this project, and I will encourage you to read the leaflet that GCP has sent to households in the area. You should respond to the consultation which focuses primarily on the Environmental Impact Assessment identifying the impacts of the scheme on the area and how to mitigate it. I have already raised concerns about a wrong map in the consultation document and it has been corrected. I encourage parish councils, especially Bourn and Caldecote to respond. I will also submit comments on your behalf so feel free to contact me and check my blog for updates

Luton Airport Flight Path and Holding Area change

Some of you would have seen more large commercial aeroplanes and more air traffic trails across the skies over our ward villages, right across from Caldecote to Little Gransden. In some areas, many have reported increased level of aircraft noise too. The reason is that in February this year, London Luton Airport (LLA) changed its arrival paths and holding area for flights into Luton.



The Civil Aviation Authority (CAA) approved the airspace change in November 2021 following an extensive public consultation that took place from October 2020 to February 2021. In my monthly report at the time, I advised parish councils of the consultation and encouraged them to respond, and they did. The consultation had shown that flights would be above 8,000 ft in most and 9,000ft in some areas above our ward. Unfortunately, that is not what is happening now.

I am now working with a group of concerned residents across our Ward and Huntingdonshire, collating noise data and Parish Councils so we can raise a formal objection to the CAA and LLA. We are also holding a public meeting on Tuesday **5th July**, **7.30pm at Little Gransden Village Hall** which I encourage those affected to attend

Accessible parking only is available at the Wellcome Genome Campus – blue badge holders will be required to display their badge. All other parking is available at the Babraham Research Campus and a free park and ride service for the 10 minute journey will be in operation every 20 to 30 minutes. Monkey Pox

The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) has announced that monkeypox is to be listed as a notifiable disease. Legislation has been laid which will make monkeypox a notifiable infectious disease under the Health Protection (Notification) Regulations 2010 from 8 June. This means all doctors in England are required to notify their local council or local Health Protection Team (HPT) if they suspect a patient has monkeypox. To date, the UKHSA announced that it has detected 73 additional cases of monkeypox in England, two additional cases in Scotland and two in Wales. This
